A Letter from the Manse at Monymusk



Dear Parishioners,




The Old, Old Story – An Easter Reflection

Tell me the story slowly, That I may take it in - That wonderful redemption, God's remedy for sin;

Tell me the story often, For I forget so soon.

And so we reach Easter. It is time to deck the churches with fresh flowers, Easter bonnets and maybe even a chocolate egg or two. Just as the long cold days of winter give way to the longer, lighter days of spring, so the penitent season of Lent — in which we gave up chocolates or social media or, in my case Brussels sprouts — gives way the dazzling light of Easter Morning. And we'll tell again the "Old, Old Story" of Jesus' Resurrection. Except that we won't.

Instead, we tend to tell cleaned-up stories of Jesus at Easter. Laced in high theology of the wonder of Resurrection we usually try to emphasize the transition from earth to heaven. "If Jesus could make it out alive and become good enough for heaven — you can too!" we seem to say. Depictions of the Resurrected Jesus in art show him aglow with holiness and perfection. We want him to look impressive. It's also the picture we imagine of what we should be like once we are saved / redeemed / become Christian / heaven-bound. It's funny though, because the Bible tells us that Mary, the one person who actually did see him at his Resurrection, mistook Jesus for the gardener. No disrespect to gardeners, but most gardeners are less likely to be resplendent in white robes, attended by hosts of angels, and more likely to have dirt on their overalls and under their nails. Maybe Mary mistook Jesus for the gardener because he was still covered in the dirt from his own tomb.

Lutheran pastor, Nadia Bolz-Weber points out that the Easter story is not about Jesus becoming impressive and shiny, but about him becoming new. Similarly, the Good News of the Resurrection is not about us being made nicer, but about us becoming new. And, as anyone who has ever held a

newborn baby knows, "new" is often messy and fragile. As Bolz-Weber puts it:

"New looks like recovering alcoholics. New looks like reconciliation between two family members - neither of which actually deserve it. New looks like every time I manage to admit I was wrong and every time I manage to not mention when I'm right. New looks like every fresh start and every act of forgiveness and every moment of letting go of what we thought we couldn't live without and then somehow living without it anyway. New is the thing you never saw coming ...never even hoped for, but ends up being what you needed all along and it happens to all of us. Because God simply keeps reaching down into the dirt of humanity and pulling us out of the graves we dig for ourselves through our violence, our lies, our selfishness, our arrogance, and our addictions. And God keeps loving us back to life over and over."

This Easter may you take the time to hear or read again the old, old story of God's love in Jesus. And, messy as it may be, may you find a new beginning – however you may be longing for it.



Minutes of Bennachie Parish Kirk Session held on 6th March 2024 at 6.45 for 7pm at Midmar Church. Items shared or discussed with no decision or actions are not included in this summary.

Constitution - Rev. Tose Shayamunda constituted the Kirk Session (Session) of the Bennachie Parish Church (BPC) and read from John Ch. 2 vs 13-17. Rev. Euan Glen led the Session in prayer.

Minutes of Meeting of the 23rd January 2024 were accepted, proposed by Noel Lord, seconded by Rev. Euan Glen, subject to two minor amendments.

Matters Arising

BPC Website – Session agreed that Communication Team were to meet with the representative of each pre-Union Churches website coordinator to start moving content across to a centralised BPC website.

Elders Away Day – Session agreed to leave it to the Ministers to find a date and venue as the current planned date of 27th April cannot be held at the Kemnay Church Centre and alternatives are expensive.

Office Administration Post – Kirk Session ratified the Administration committee's decision to offer the post to one of the applicants.

Water Rates and External Audit Costs – Session agreed that Moderator would continue to raise the issue at Presbytery to lobby Church of Scotland in Edinburgh.

Rev Tose Shayamunda - Session agreed that Moderator was to ask for a formal reply to Sessions requests to Presbytery to firstly extend TS contract and secondly, to change the requirement that the Church could not use its funds for TS visas.

Items of Interest

IDCT - Session agreed that the Easter and Pentecost events for IDCT would be advertised / included in intimations as each Church required but that BPC churches will not be closed for the IDCT Pentecost event.

Local Leadership Team Reports

Chapel of Garioch – Session agreed that the alterations to the pews would be acceptable, and that the local leadership team could take the property change to Presbytery for approval. Session agreed to the cost to use the village hall for the Joint Service in June. Session agreed to the Plant and Seeds sale to take place.

Cluny and Monymusk – Session agreed to a paid cleaner for the Church.

Roll Changes – The roll was shared. The Session removed by resolution several members from the roll due to either lack of contact information or having moved out of area.

Other Business - Sharing Information – Session agreed to an action on the Ministers that they inform the Session (potentially through the online BPC Calendar) when they are on holiday or unavailable.

Next Meeting - The meeting adjourned with the Grace and a reminder of the wonder of Midmar Church and the cloud of witness that has served the area and the Lord over the last 275 years. Session will next meet on 15th April at Monymusk church at 7pm.

A Tale from Littlewood Court: Nell McKay

In the first edition of the Bennachie Parish Church Newsletter, I introduced Littlewood Court, a Sheltered Housing Unit in Kemnay. Now I plan to introduce some of the residents.

Nell McKay's early years were spent in Ternemny Cottage, near Keith in Banffshire. Her father rented the nearby farm of Knock, before eventually purchasing it. Members of Nell's family still farm there. Nell had 5 siblings all of whom lived into their 90's; she herself is in her mid 90's! I promised not to tell her age.......Nell fondly remembers the horses used on the farm, now of course replaced by tractors.

Nell went to the primary local school which was a mile's walk through muddy woodland. Her journey to Keith Academy was made by train, in the days when trains stopped at Knock Station on their way to Keith. Nell continued her studies at the Training College for teachers in Aberdeen, fondly known as the TC. She taught in local primary schools before meeting her husband to be, Lesley, also a teacher. They celebrate 64 years of marriage this year.

Like most women of that time, Nell stopped work when she married, and soon their daughter Jennifer came along. Lesley worked in Inverurie for a time where Nell founded the playgroup at the West Church and was their first leader. Lesley was promoted to Headmaster in Kemnay and the family moved here in 1972. Nell was named the Dominie's wife for a long time, but quickly established her own identity as she became involved with Kemnay Kirk. She volunteered in the lunch club, notably at the Loaves and Fishes café, and was a committed Elder for very many years, delivering newsletters and supporting the members of her district. She only very recently gave up those roles.

One of the many tasks which Nell undertook was diary keeping for the Church Centre in Kemnay. You dared not use a room there without speaking to Nell first!

So what is Nell's secret of a long life well lived? Her church life, as well as good home cooked food and a happy marriage I am sure. Only very recently did their garden defeat them, and she and Lesley moved into Littlewood Court. She still makes her own soup, but also very much enjoys the friendly, supportive atmosphere in Littlewood Court.

The biggest changes she thinks of in her long life? Computers! None the

less, Nell has her iPad, and has logged in on Teams to Session meetings and services and has been a contributor to an online bible study. What of the future? Nell expects change to continue but does feel the new Church of Bennachie Parish is settling in, and she enjoys the different ministers.

Nell, thank you for letting me (albeit reluctantly!) have a blether and write a little about you. It has been a privilege.


